

Surrendering or Re-homing your Pet

If you are looking to surrender your pet or have found an animal, we recommend that you contact as many rescue organizations as possible in order to increase your chances for help. Be sure to include pictures and a brief description/history/story on the animal.

Please keep in mind that these organizations depend solely on donations, volunteers and fosters in order to be able to help, so depending on their current intake, foster, donations and resource availability will determine their response to your plea. If you are able to foster your pet or animal you have found may increase your chances on getting help from these organizations.

To Find A List Of Rescue & Animal Welfare Groups, Follow These Steps:

- Go to <https://www.petfinder.com/>
- On the top menu bar, hover over (Do Not Click) “**SHELTERS & RESCUES**”
- A drop-down menu will pop up. You can then click on “**Find an Animal Shelter or Rescue Group**”.
- You will then see a place to type your location. Make sure to enter your city and state (example: Houston, TX)
- A list of organizations in your area will then appear with their contact information.

There are also some websites that will post your pet or animal nationwide to help find an adopter.

Pet Net: <https://www.petnet.love/> They are an organization that will re-home your pet due to unexpected life changes and you can no longer take care of your pet. They will take care of everything from transport to re-homing, but they do have a fee of \$499 for their services.

When listing your pet to be re-homed, remember to never give your pet away for free. Always charge a re-homing fee of no less than \$75. A free pet is considered disposable and charging a re-homing fee will keep away people that are looking for dogs to fight, use as bait, breed and will help you find people that are seriously looking for a companion animal.
